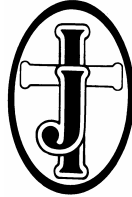

CONSTITUTION DAY ESSAY CONTEST WINNER

**Congratulations to Katie
Mahoney (6N)** on her selection
as the statewide winner in the
2009 Constitution Day essay
contest at the middle school
(grades 6-8) level!

In 2004, Congress declared that
"Constitution Day" should be
observed in schools each year
on September 17th with
programs about the history of
the Constitution. The New
Hampshire contest, for middle
and high school age students, is
held annually as part of this
observance.

This year, students were asked
to consider how the First
Amendment right of Free
Speech affects students while in
a school building. The essay
topic was: "In your opinion,
when should a school be
allowed to ban t-shirts that have

certain kinds of messages and pictures on them?”

Katie acknowledged that some students believe banning certain clothing takes away their freedom. She does not agree, especially if the clothing is inappropriate or disrespectful. She wrote, “Students have to know that with freedom comes responsibility. If children want to protest something, they can do it in a non-harmful way that doesn’t hurt anyone’s feelings and still gets their message out.”

All 12 statewide finalists have been invited to a reception at the Supreme Court in Concord on November 3rd hosted by Chief Justice John T. Broderick, Jr. and the associate justices of the Supreme Court.

As the statewide winner in her age category, Katie will also be reading her essay aloud in the courtroom. How exciting!

This seems an appropriate time to remind everyone that there is a **Memorial Donation Program** at Infant Jesus School. Infant Jesus School will follow the **NASHUA SCHOOL DISTRICT** for delays and cancellations. If Nashua is delayed or cancelled, so is Infant Jesus.

In the event of a 90-minute delay, the **Half-Day Kindergarten** session will automatically be cancelled. **The Full Day Kindergarten** session normally starts at 8:30 am, so with a 90 minute delay, they would start at **10:00 am**.

Grades 1-6 normally start school at 9:00 am, so if we have a 90-minute delay that means those classes would begin at **10:30 am**.

There is no one in the office to answer the phone until **9:30 am**.

Please watch WMUR-TV News 9, and help us reduce the number of phone calls we receive when there is a delayed opening. **Please** do not call the school, rectory, or convent. Thank you.
